Kris has spent over 10 years in education, working primarily with school age nonprofits in the greater Boston area. From 2017 to 2018, Kris was the Education Director for School on Wheels, a program serving the educational needs of homeless youth living in shelters and scattered site apartments in and throughout southeast Massachusetts. During that time, she assisted in the development of STEM and literacy programs and expanded the program to reach six additional learning sites, including in new communities such as Dorchester and Kingston. Kris is currently a Ph.D. candidate at Lesley University, and her dissertation study is on the impact of student service-learning experiences on values formation.

Kris regularly volunteers and is a proponent of civic engagement. She is a member of the Norwood Conservation Commission and has worked with the Norwood Benchmark Senior Living Community as a volunteer activities coordinator. She has also volunteered at Easton Wings of Hope, a collaborative designed to bring attention to youth substance abuse. In the past, she was a PlaySpace Leader for Horizons for Homeless Children and worked with Building Impact on projects for Habitat for Humanity. She is a licensed elementary school principal, reading specialist, and English teacher. She works now as a reading interventionist at the Blackstone-Millville Middle School and is the education director for the Immigrant Family Services Institute of Roslindale.
